- 50 cigars/1 carton (200 sticks) cigarettes.
- 1 litre or one quart of spirits (including liqueurs and cordials).
- 1 litre or one quart of wine.

Prohibited/Restricted Goods

- The importation of controlled drugs and utensils used therewith, is absolutely prohibited.
- The importation of firearms, ammunition and explosives is Prohibited unless accompanied by the prescribed permit issued in Jamaica.
- Fruits, vegetables, plants and live animals may be imported only if the owner is in possession of a valid permit issued in Jamaica.
